Holy Communion

P: When we gather for Holy Communion, we hear again the story of God's mighty acts, and of the love shown us in the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. With thanksgiving, we remember that:

In the night in which He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: *"Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."* Again after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks and gave it for all to drink saying: *"This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this in remembrance of Me."*

The Pastor and Assistant then give the Bread and Wine, saying:

P: The body of Christ, given for you.

The blood of Christ, shed for you.

Prayer

P: We give you thanks, Almighty God, that you have refreshed us through the healing power of this gift of life; and we pray that in your mercy you would strengthen us, through this gift, in faith toward you and in fervent love toward one another; for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. **C: Amen**

P: Lord, now let your servant go in peace; your word has been fulfilled. My own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of all people; A light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel. (*Luke 2:32*)

Closing Hymn: Christ the Lord is Risen Today (LBW #130, vss. 1, 4)

Responsive Commissioning and Blessing

C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

P: Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

Order of Worship

Gather in Silence

The women approached Jesus' tomb in the early hours and were surprised by the words, "Jesus is raised and is not here." Let us approach this service with a sense of the mystery that surrounds the journey from death to life.

Call to Worship:

C: Come, God, arise! Bring forth the sun from its slumber, and Jesus from the tomb. Break forth the Holy Light, your Blessed Child.

P: Greet us with Your peace on this morning of mystery and hope.

C: Amen.

Opening Prayer

God of all mercy and grace, your only Son's death and glorious resurrection have delivered us from the power of death and redeemed all creation. Grant that we may no longer look for the living among the dead and instead daily die to sin and rise to newness of life; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

In the name of Jesus Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the \blacksquare Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen
