## Adult Forums This Sunday and January 20

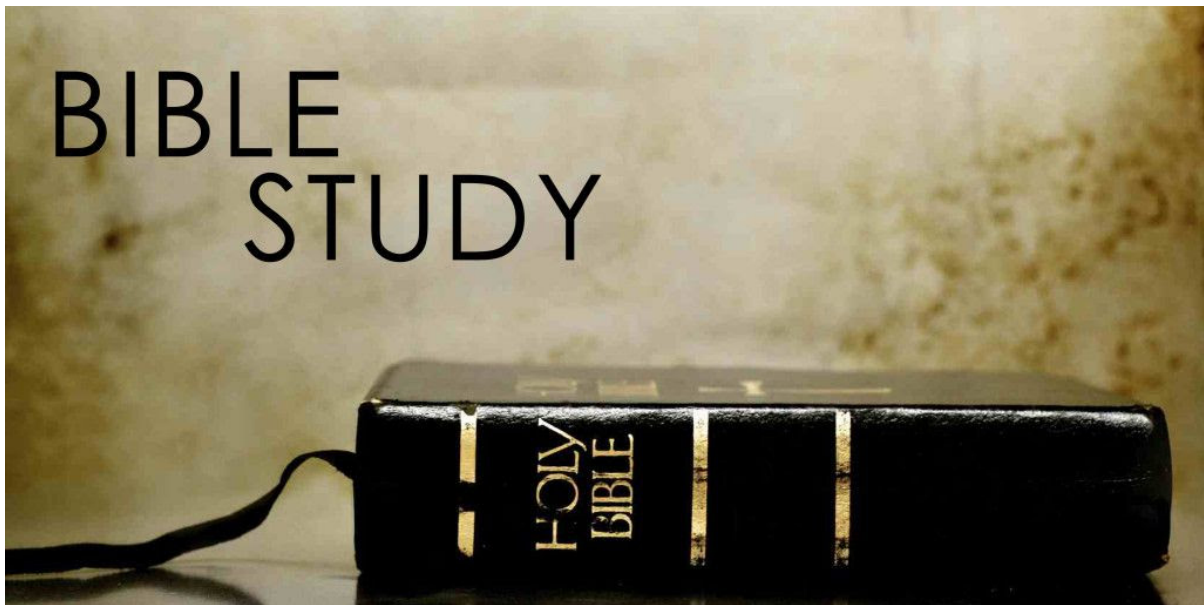

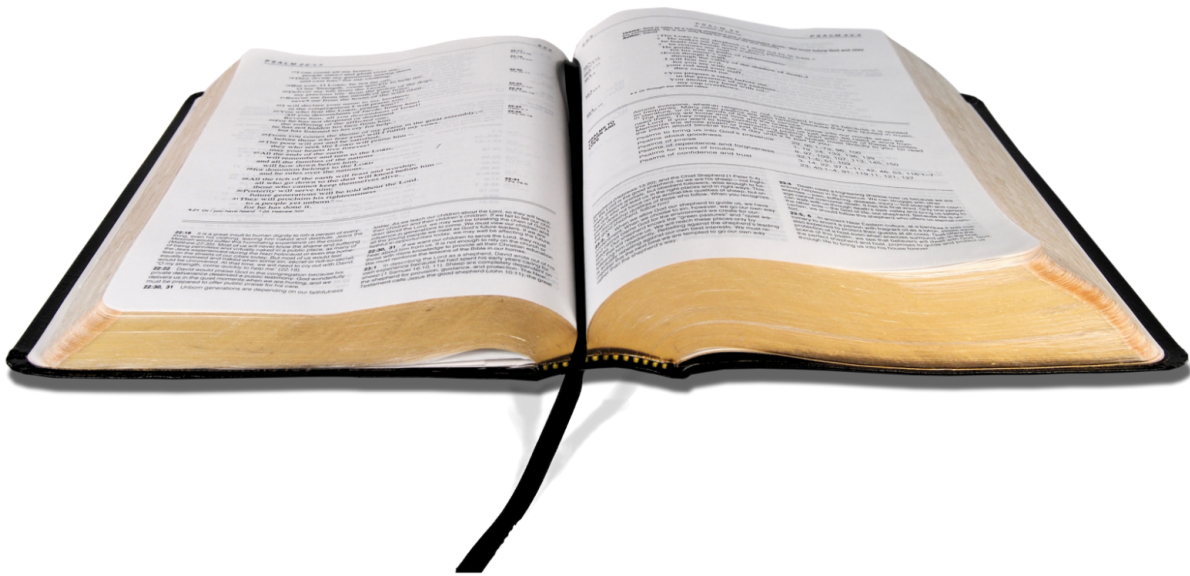
