The work in our worship space continues. Thank you to all who are helping! Please take a look in there and see all that is happening.

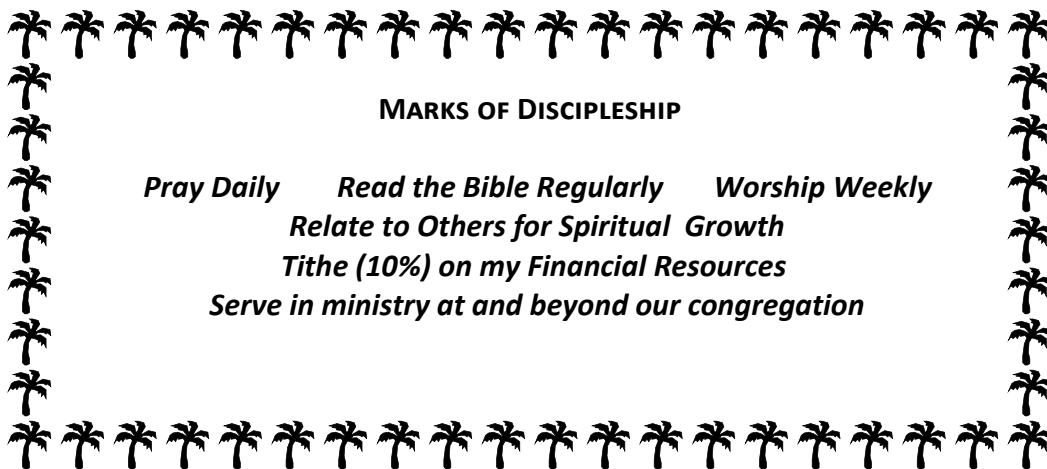
During this month of June, we are worshipping in the fellowship hall.
