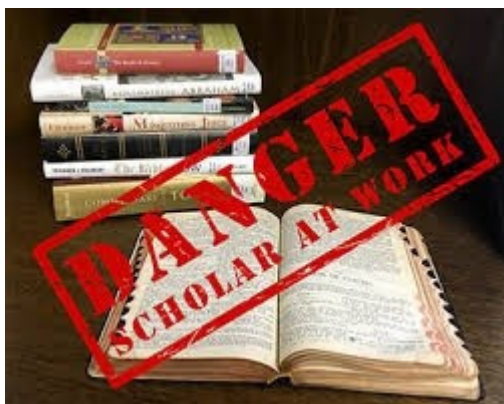

Did You Know – Bible Chapters and Verses

Did you know that chapter numbers and verse numbers were not added to the Bible until the 16th Century? For the first almost 1500 years of the Bible's existence, there were no notations for chapters or verses.

The books of the Bible were meant to be read from start to finish; as such there was no division into chapter or verses. In the mid-1500s chapter and verse numbers were added. They were added for convenience, to make it easier to find and reference passages.

If you read a Bible study written before the 16th Century, there was no language of chapter or verse such as John 3:16. The studies would simply have to quote the whole passage. (For God so love the world that He gave His only Son, so that whoever believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life.)
