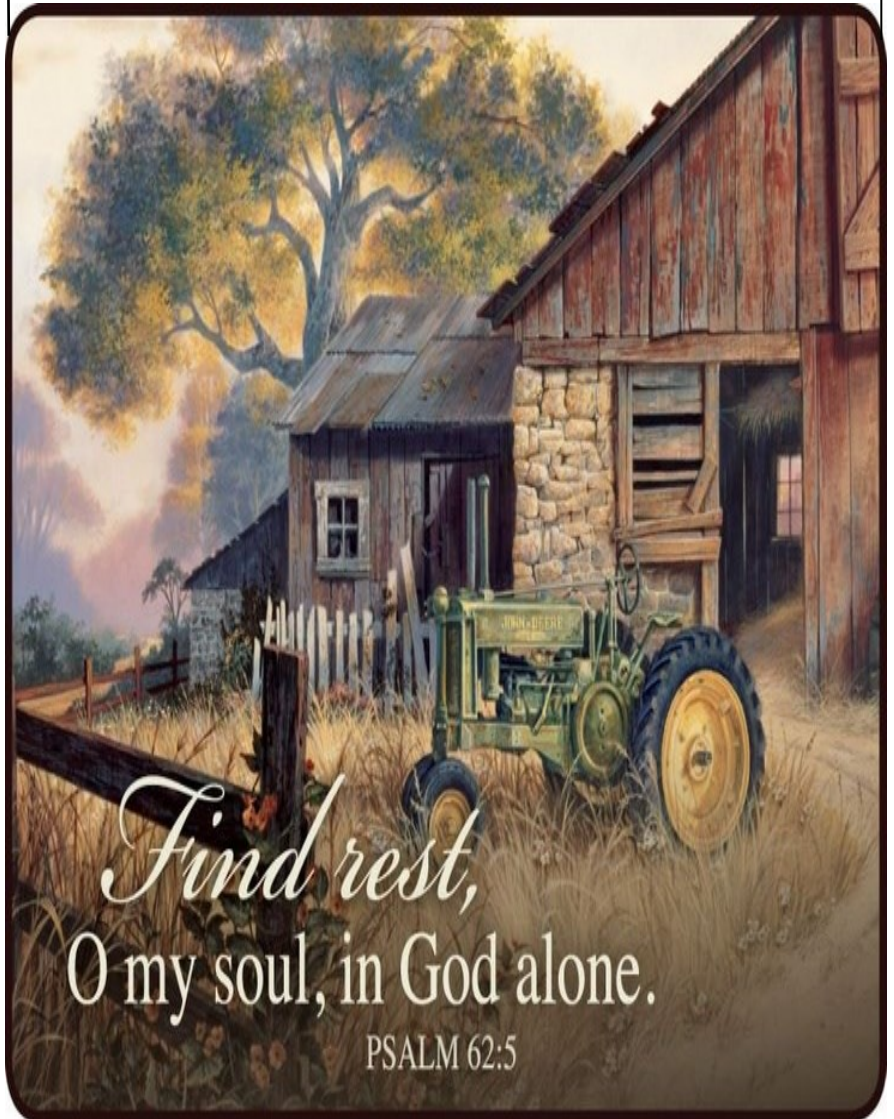

## Primetimers

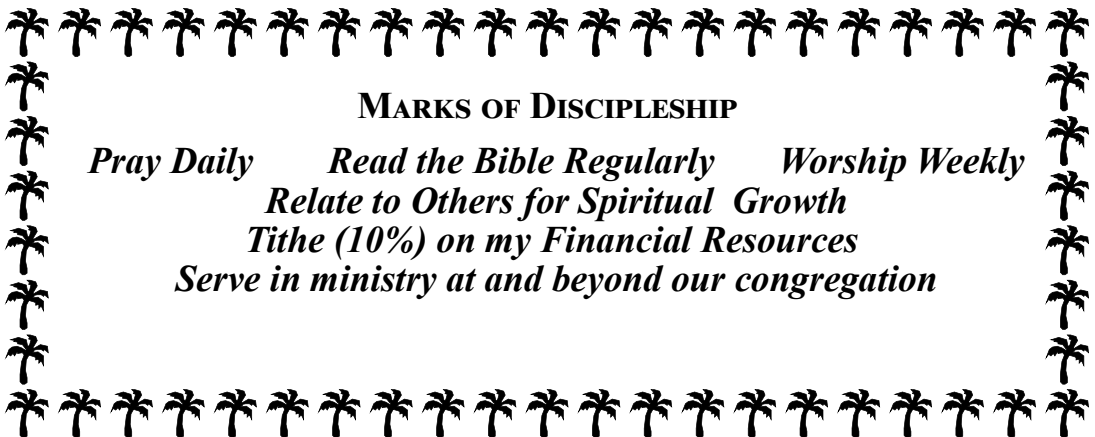
