More on the NALC

Last week we shared about the national structure of the NALC. We in the NALC deliberately have a lean national structure to insure that the focus of the NALC is on congregational ministry. We do have some additional local structure. The NALC is divided up into 33 mission districts. The mission districts vary in size, but the hope is to have them about 10-12 congregations. Each mission district is led by a missions dean, one of the pastors in the district. The mission district is a gathering of local congregations to share in ministry and mission and support together. Our mission district is the North Texas Mission District. It is geographically large as it covers all of northern Texas, stretching all the way from Odessa to Tyler. It is composed of 9 congregations. Our mission dean is Rev. John Scheusner of All Saint's Lutheran Church in Arlington.
