



Passing of the Peace

"On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." –John 20:19-21

Our Church Council met this past Sunday and the Passing of the Peace was prayerful discussed. Earlier, the council had decided to suspend this part of our worship due to Covid-19 concerns. Though we are still looking for ways to keep everyone as safe as possible, it was decided to add the Passing of the Peace back into our worship—but with some qualifications. First, please do not feel that you have to participate in this. In Christian love for one another, we encourage each member and guest to engage in worship in ways that support their own health needs. Second, if you chose to engage in this part of the worship please do so in a way that supports the ongoing need for social distancing. When we get to this part of the service please stay in place, turn to those immediately around you, and share the blessing of peace in a safe manner. I have seen members simply wave or touch elbows or bump fists; I've even seen those of a certain age flash the 'peace sign' to one another. This seems to be making a comeback along with bell bottom jeans!

The mechanics of how it is done is not important, but what it represents is. The resurrected Lord calmed the fears of His disciples with His peace. As we prepare for Communion we remind one another in the sharing of the peace that Christ has promised to be present in this Holy Meal. Asking the Lord to bestow His peace on a fellow believer is living out the words we profess in the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" (see Matthew 5:24).
