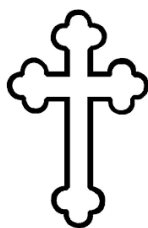

***The Sacrament of Baptism for
Willow Marie, Dakota Craig & Sage Jordan Dormanen***



Pastor: We have gathered as God's community around the waters of new life. The word of God comes to us through the Apostle Paul: "But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life" (Titus 3:5-7). In Holy Baptism our Heavenly Father liberates us from sin, death and the devil by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We were born children of a fallen humanity, in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit, we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with Him and with His people, we grow in faith, love and obedience to the will of God.

Pastor: Who is being presented for Holy Baptism?

Micah & Leslie Darling: **We present Willow, Dakota and Sage Dormanen to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.**

Pastor: From ancient times, the Church has observed the custom of appointing sponsors to stand with baptismal candidates as they receive the Sacrament, and in their continuing life of faith. Micah and Leslie, this is a significant commitment, calling you to reflect the love of Christ in their lives. Do you promise to nurture them in the Christian faith and help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: We do with God's help.

Tyler and Hannah, as Christian parents you are entrusted with responsibilities toward your children, including bringing them to the worship services of God's house and teaching them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As they grow in years, you should nurture and instruct them in the Holy Scriptures and at the proper time prepare them to receive Holy Communion and to live out their faith as fruitful disciples of Christ. Do you promise to fulfill these holy obligations?

Parents: We do with God's help.

Pastor: Do you renounce the principalities and powers of this evil world – the devil, and all his empty promises?

Parents and Sponsors: We do by God's grace.

Church Family and Friends Stand Together

Pastor: I ask each of you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize, the faith reflected in the ancient words of the Creed.

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

***People:* I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**
