Glory Gopinath Mission Trip

Glory recently shared with us her recent experiences on a mission trip to India. Below is the narrative that Glory wrote.

As most of you know, this last December I went to India. I hadn't celebrated Christmas there in over 47 years so it was really special for me. Pastor graciously allowed me to share a few pictures of my latest adventure with you all. Of course I enjoy spending some time with family and friends, my main goal is to organize several small charity projects whenever I go. Nothing too big but things that really do make a huge impact on the lives that they touch. Victory Children's Home is an orphanage in a small village where the weather gets a little cooler at night. Their most important need at that time was blankets. I was able to distribute blankets to 58 orphans there. Great Joy Children's Home is a group of 17 orphans who lost both parents to COVID 19. Then there is a Christian school for the hearing impaired in my hometown. I was able to provide a special Christmas lunch for all the students there. Next we found 3 extremely small poor churches that we distributed 15 hymnals and 15 bibles each. I had sent 2 parcels by sea mail hoping they would arrive while I was there but because of their delay, I had to extend my trip. But let me tell you, it was worth. There are so many poor villages every where you look but you just go where God leads you and He led me to this particular village. It was just so amazing to see the smiles on their faces. Some of these kids have never had a surprise like this. Now that's the magic of Christmas. I also wanted to share this picture of me at the church where I was baptized in 1949. Thank you all so very much for your support and prayers. I hope I can do so much more with the help of my OSLC family. Thank you.
