THE SHARING OF THE PEACE

It is Christ who invites us to meet Him here. Adults and children not receiving communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing.

P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. C: It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

P: It is indeed good, right, and salutary that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to You, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord. In the wonder and mystery of the Word made flesh you have opened the eyes of faith to a new and radiant vision of your glory; that, beholding the God made visible, we may be drawn to love the God whom we cannot see.
