WORDS OF CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

As the Pastor says the Invocation, the Sign of the Cross ✠ may be made in remembrance of our Baptisms.

P: We gather in this sanctuary, and we worship, in the name of the Father, and of the ✠ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen**

P: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love You and worthily magnify Your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **C: Amen**

P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

P: Most merciful God,

C: We confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways, to the glory of Your holy name. Amen

P: Almighty God, in His mercy, has given his Son to die for us and, for His sake, forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ, and by His authority, I declare to you the Good News, "Your sins are forgiven," in the name of the Father, and of the ✠ Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

APOSTOLIC GREETING

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

THE CANDLES OF ADVENT – PEACE

A: The Advent wreath includes many symbols to help us think about Christ and His gifts. The wreath itself is in the shape of a circle. A circle has no beginning and no end. This reminds us that there is no beginning and no end to God and that God's love is forever.

A: On the four Sundays in Advent, we light an additional candle each week. We mark the four candles with these four words: Hope – PEACE – Joy – Love.

A: The light from the candles, will grow stronger each Sunday in Advent. The candle's light reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world.

A: Last Sunday we lit the candle of Hope. Today we light the candles of hope and the candle of PEACE.

(Light the Candles now)

A: The angels announced PEACE and goodwill at the birth of Jesus. At the end of time, Christ will come with the angels to usher in His eternal PEACE. Sin, death and the evil ones will be removed, and He will reign with peace in the new kingdom forever and ever.

P: Let us pray:

We thank You Lord for the hope You give us. We ask that as we wait for all Your promises to come true, and for Christ to come again, that You would remain present with us. Help us today, and everyday to worship You, to hear Your word, and to do Your will by sharing Your hope and peace with each other. We ask this in the name of the One who was born in Bethlehem – Jesus.

C: Amen.
